From the Pastor's Desk


Fr. Joseph Appointed as the Next Pastor for Assumption Parish

Just as the bulletin was being finalized, I got word that Fr. Joseph had been appointed pastor of Assumption parish, effective Wednesday, June 26th. I am sure you join with me in congratulating him on his new assignment — new in that he will take on the pastoral responsibilities for the entire parish, not just various programs; not-so-new in that he's been actively pastoring our parish for the past eight years.


In making the appointment, the Bishop indicated that our parish will not be getting a replacement. That means our parish will join the ranks of several neighboring parishes which are designated as "one-priest" parishes. Naturally this is going to require an adjustment on the part of all parishioners. Fr. Joseph will have to figure out some of these adjustments, but they certainly will involve daily mass schedules, figuring out the administrative piece (currently I take care of all that, whereas most parishes hire a business administrator), etc. More on all that as we get closer to the transition date.

There is no need to extol Fr. Joseph's capabilities. They are quite apparent, and I've made no secret in expressing my admiration and esteem for his abilities. I have no doubt that the parish will be blessed by his leadership. Together let's rejoice in the wonderful gift the Lord has given us in assigning our own brother-in-the Lord to continue leading us in the ways of the Kingdom.

Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

In keeping with the spirit of penance, all Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat/poultry on all the Fridays of Lent.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fiftynine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of
fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This
means limiting oneself to a single full meal and
avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals,
which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health
would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper
cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required
to excuse oneself from Good Friday fast and abstinence.
