From the Pastor's Desk

This Sunday is my last pastor's column. On Wednesday I enter the ranks of "the retired," at which time Fr. Joseph will become our new pastor.

I want to spend a moment, therefore, thanking all who have helped make my time at Assumption Parish for the past nine years a time of joy and personal growth. I have been blessed in more ways than I can count: the fraternal support and love of Fr. Joseph and Msgr. Curley, the hard work of Deacon Mike and our parish staff who helped implement new and exciting opportunities for the parish, and, of course, all of those whose prayerful love and support put flesh on dreams and visions of becoming a vibrant parish centered on the Lord.

There is much for which the parish can be proud. In many ways we've forged new paths and become models for others as we tried to embody the Gospel of Jesus in which we have placed our hope. I am particularly grateful for our "Take Back Sunday" program, followed closely by our numerous Alpha Courses which were started by Fr. Joseph to help our youth and then quickly moved to our adult community. These are but two examples where our parish has taken a lead striving to remedy the growing disconnect between family religious practice and faith-formation. I thank God that we have been able to take these steps during my time as pastor.

In addition, I am thankful for the generosity and support of the dedicated group of parishioners without whom we would not have been able to run our parish offices or provide adequate office space in our refurbished parish center; nor would we have been able to take care of the many facility repairs which had to be done — church roof, windows, boiler, interior renovation, parking lot, lighting, parish center windows, roof, computers, etc. Without their support we'd be unable to function. I thank God that they have stepped forward to accomplish all that needed to be done.

Many have asked me what I intend to do when I retire. Without the responsibility of pastoring, with its ever increasing spiritual and administrative challenges, I will have more time to spend in prayer as well as be present and available to my mother. There was much that I had ignored during these years because time did not allow which I now can begin to revisit: music, reading, writing. In addition, I will remain present to support Fr. Joseph.

Be assured of my continued prayers for you and for our Church. And please remember me when you come before the Lord, especially during the Eucharist.

Steubenville Youth Conference

Parking Lot Repair

At the urging of our parish’s Pastoral Council, we’ve begun repairing our parking lot area. It’s a massive and expensive project — one that must be done now because of safety concerns. I had hoped to wait until all the pledges were collected before beginning this project. Safety, however, dictates that we do this now before someone is injured. I know it will be inconvenient as the project unfolds; your patience is much appreciated.

Change in Daily Mass Schedule

With Fr. Chris’ retirement our parish officially becomes a “one-priest parish.” This will require some changes in our daily mass schedule as well as our expectations as to when and where a priest might be available.

Parishes who are “one-priest parishes” (there are more than 30) normally have one mass a day, with no masses on Friday or Saturday morning. Fr. Joseph has decided that he would have one mass a day at 9:00 a.m., Monday through Friday. There will be no Saturday morning mass since there will be mass on Saturday at 5:30 p.m. as usual. The Miraculous Medal Novena which had taken place on Saturday will now take place after the 9:00 a.m. mass on Wednesdays. The Sunday schedule will remain the same.

All of this will require a time of adjustment. Your cooperation and support are most appreciated.
